

Kimochis



Our students have been very excited to start the Kimochis program this past month! Kimochis (meaning ‘feeling’ in Japanese) is based on research showing that early instruction of social, emotional, and behavioral skills can help children develop positive peer interactions, and problem-solving. Each week we will meet a new character from the Kimochi team and discuss the feelings that the character encounters. Some of those may be feelings we “like to have” and the feelings that can be “hard to have”. Students will have the opportunity to share their experiences and how they relate to those feelings and then learn strategies to help understand and problem-solve when those “hard to have” feelings occur. Each character has a stuffy the students get to interact with and a book describing the character’s story. We plan to get together once a week as a whole school for this program, as well as continue our learning throughout the week as opportunities arise to connect the concepts in our classrooms. There will be information sent to parents providing examples of ways to discuss Kimochis at home. Kimochis is such an exciting program, and we can’t wait to see how the students continue to grow in their social-emotional education, having fun along the way!



MIKISIWI-PÎSIM EAGLE MOON

PRONOUNCED- MIK-SOO-EE-PEE-SIM

Soaring into February to welcome the Eagle moon. This is the moon where the eagle returns and begins to build or repair their nest in preparation of mating season. Since eagles are such large birds their nests are often 4-6 ft long and 2-4 ft deep! The eagle is a very special bird and also brings us the teaching of love.

The eagle represents love because they have the strength to carry all of the teachings in their sacred wings. The eagle has the ability to fly highest in the sky and closest to the Creator.
